Responsive by Design Communities are living systems.

They change, adapt and grow as new challenges emerge and new opportunities take shape. A strong community is not defined only by its traditions, but also by its ability to respond when circumstances shift.

At the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation, responsiveness guides how we listen, how we act and how we steward the generosity entrusted to us. Our work is shaped by close relationships with donors, nonprofit partners and community leaders who help us identify where support is needed most – whether that is immediate or long-term. By design, we are built to move resources where they can make the greatest difference.

- Approving over \$70,000 in grants providing matching funds to help leverage additional investment from government and private funders into our community to: support the reimagining of an underutilized Olean city park; to support place-building mural projects that encourage economic development in the Salamanca business district; and create top of the line meeting spaces for our nonprofit community through a renovation project at Southern Tier Health Care Systems
- Granting \$4,500 towards mental wellness initiatives through the Mental Wellness in Cattaraugus County Fund, including assisting veterans through music and nature-based mental health programming for underserved populations

Responsiveness also comes to life when our community mobilizes together. During Cattaraugus Gives, 1,714 donors rallied together to raise \$372,716 for 100 local nonprofits – a powerful demonstration of collective action.

Through the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation Rural Philanthropy Fellows Cohort, CRCF was able to hire a data and learning fellow to help us better understand the needs of the community, and where our grantmaking could have the biggest impact.

At its core, being “responsive by design” means recognizing that we are connected, and that our shared future depends on how we show up for one another.

As Theodore Roosevelt wisely said, “Do what you can, with what you have, where you are.”

This idea reflects the heart of our mission – meeting the community where it is, using the resources entrusted to us and acting with purpose to create meaningful impact. As you move through this report, we hope you see how listening leads to action and how kindness leads to advancement.

We are deeply grateful to the donors, partners and volunteers who make this work possible. Your trust and commitment allow the Foundation to respond with intention today while helping build a stronger, more resilient community for tomorrow.

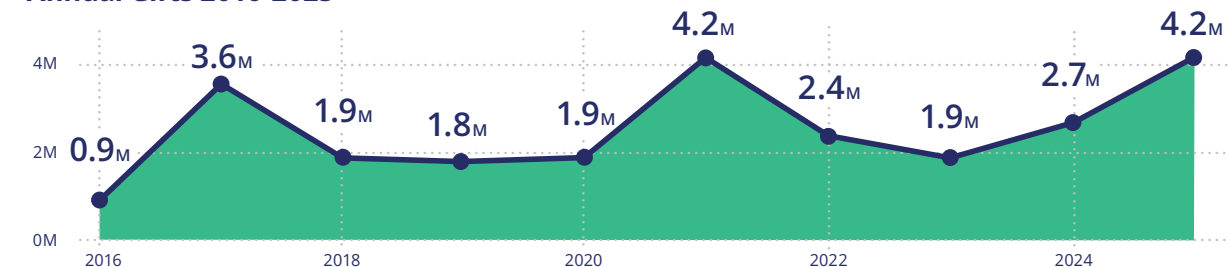

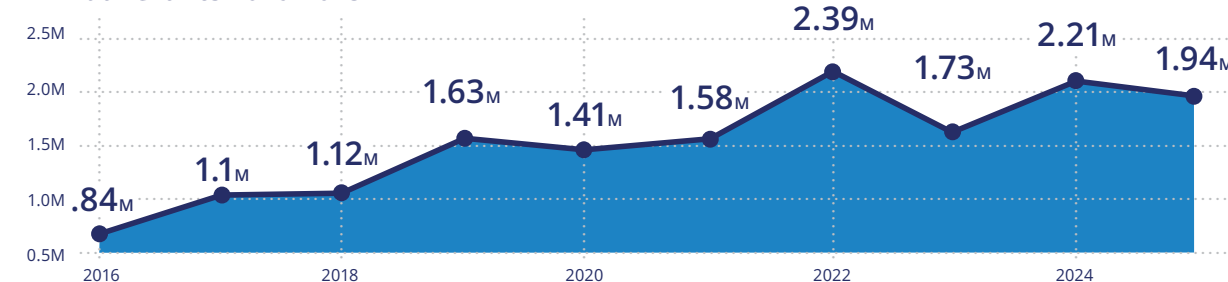
Foundation Impact Since 2016

Annual Gifts 2016-2025



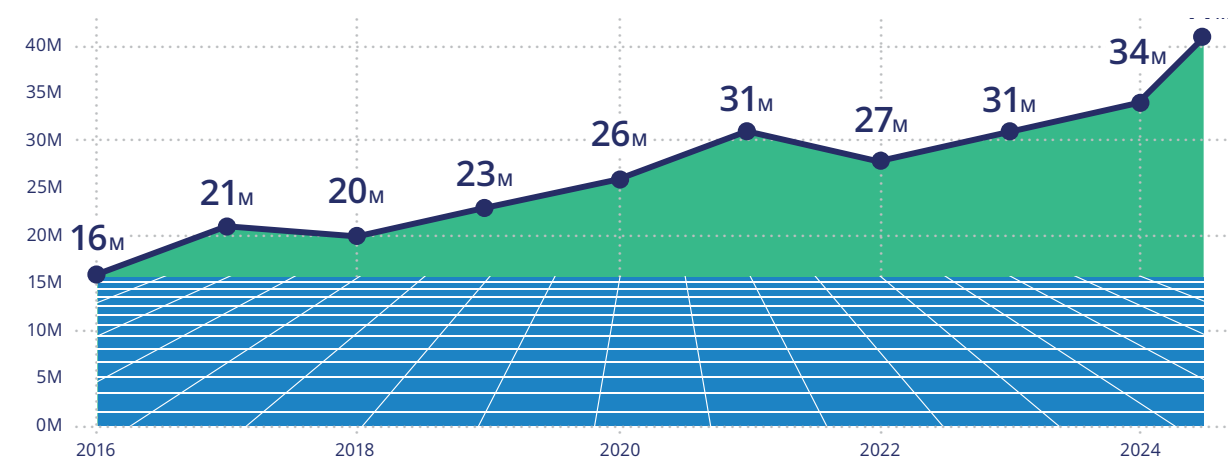
Total Gifts: \$25,513,373

The Enduring Impact of Thomas Barnes

When Thomas Barnes walked across the Portville Central School stage as a member of the Class of 1974, he likely didn't imagine that more than five decades later his name would be synonymous with opportunity and inspiration.

Tom never lost his connection to his hometown, though his career unfolded well beyond Cattaraugus County. That sense of place stayed with him, shaping not only what he accomplished, but how – and why – he chose to give back.

Tom believed deeply in communities and the people who shape them. Whether he was teaching in a classroom, playing saxophone on a local stage or helping guide regional development efforts, he approached life with an unflappable faith in the power of education, culture and civic engagement.

His academic path reflected a wide range of interests.

He earned degrees from Cornell University and the State University of New York at Buffalo, studying the arts, business and law. Education was not merely a steppingstone for him – it was a calling.

Over the years, he shared his knowledge with students at institutions including Cornell University, Mercyhurst College, Ithaca College, Alfred State College and Alfred University, teaching subjects that spanned hotel administration, business and related fields.

Beyond the classroom, Tom dedicated decades to strengthening the region he loved.

For more than 30 years, he served on the Southern Tier West Regional Planning and Development Board, where his leadership helped secure funding for infrastructure and economic development across southwestern New York. He played a key role in establishing organizations such as the Southern Tier Extension Railroad Authority and the Southern Tier West Development Foundation – efforts that continue to support growth and opportunity throughout the region.

Extending his service to civic and cultural life, Tom chaired the City of Olean Planning Board and lent his time and expertise to numerous boards and organizations. The arts, in particular, held a special place in his heart. As a founding board member and later president of the Cattaraugus County Arts Council (now the Tri-County Arts Council), Tom championed creative expression as a vital part of community well-being.

In recognition of his impact, the council renamed its highest most prestigious honor “the Thomas Barnes Lifetime Achievement Award.”

The arts were not just something Tom supported – it was something he lived. Friends and colleagues remember him performing saxophone with groups like the Mojo Hand Blues Band, bringing the same joy and energy to the stage that he brought to his civic work.

Dan Wintermantel, a longtime friend of Tom and colleague at the Arts Council, recalled fond memories of him:

“After a busy week of meetings, heavy organizational lifting and important municipal work, Tom would play saxophone into the wee hours of the night with the Mojo Hand Blues Band,” remembered Dan. “The Doctor, we called him, would let his hair down and the evening would grow hysterical, ridiculous, outrageous, and often, surprisingly profound.”

When Tom passed away in 2024, his lifelong values were reflected in his final act of generosity.

His estate designated \$1 million for charitable purposes to support institutions that mattered deeply to him. \$200,000 was allocated to four local nonprofits that reflect his lifelong passions and civic contributions, with each organization receiving \$50,000. Those organizations include the Tri-County Arts Council, the Portville Free Library, The Cattaraugus County SPCA and the Olean Public Library.

Two agencies received their gifts as a contribution to their existing agency endowments to support the growth of those funds that benefit their agencies. New funds were established in Tom's name to support the SPCA in Cattaraugus County and the Olean Public Library.

The remaining \$800,000 was designated to the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation to establish the Thomas M. Barnes Scholarship Fund, a four-year renewable award for Portville Central School students that is designed to support students throughout their undergraduate education. The scholarship reflects Tom's belief in education as a gateway to opportunity and his desire to invest in young people as they begin to shape their own paths.

Taken together, these acts of generosity paint a fuller picture of who Thomas Barnes was: a lifelong learner, a public servant, an advocate for the arts and a believer in the quiet power of thoughtful giving.

Through classrooms, boardrooms and community institutions, Tom's influence continues to be felt. His legacy is not confined to a single gift or program, but lives on in stronger communities, enriched cultural spaces and students empowered to imagine what comes next.

A Legacy of Local Philanthropy: CRCF's Community Fund

There is something powerful about neighbors helping neighbors – about generosity that doesn't seek recognition, but results.

The Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation was founded in 1994 with a bold vision: to encourage local giving, channel resources to community needs and build a legacy of impact across Cattaraugus County and beyond.

More than three decades later, CRCF has grown from a handful of funds with modest assets into an organization managing more than 350 distinct funds with over \$40 million in assets, annually generating significant grant support to local causes.

The Community Fund is CRCF's flagship unrestricted grant pool. It exists to support nonprofit projects and community initiatives that respond to immediate and evolving needs in the region. Grants from the fund are awarded through two funding cycles each year and support organizations working across a wide range of focus areas including education, health and wellness, community development, human services, youth development and more.

Often, the grants are modest in size. But their ripple effects are anything but small.

Each grant tells a story. A story of a nonprofit stretching every dollar. A story of volunteers pouring their time into service.

Since its inception, the Community Fund has invested \$284,812 back into local nonprofits to strengthen and enrich Cattaraugus County communities. In its most recent cycle, CRCF awarded \$13,500 across six organizations, supporting programs from fighting hunger to local libraries and workforce development.

Invenergy, North America's largest privately-held developer, owner and operator of clean, reliable and affordable energy solutions, made a \$5,000 charitable contribution to the Community Fund to benefit nonprofit organizations and community initiatives in the footprint of the Alle-Catt Energy Center.

The funds from Invenergy were invested into the Arcade Fire Department for extrication equipment and the Village of Franklinville for their school zone safety improvement project, with each organization receiving \$2,500.

The Community Fund has also been instrumental in getting pilot programs off the ground, setting the framework for programs that continue to make a positive impact years later.

Veggie Wheels, an initiative sponsored by the Cattaraugus County Health Department and local volunteers, was founded in 2015 with the vision of improving access to healthy foods throughout the county by connecting local farmers with local consumers.

The initial grant to Veggie Wheels from the Community Fund came in 2016 to aid in the purchase of the "Veggie Mobile" – a mobile food pantry that would travel to the populations it serves and teach them how to prepare healthy, low-cost food.

In 2018, the Veggie Wheels Fund was established at the Foundation to help the program continue in perpetuity. By 2019, the initiative was providing approximately 600 community members and children with fresh vegetables, fruit and nutritional education in the communities of Olean, Delevan and Salamanca.

"It was a way of building relationships with people," said Athena Godet-Calogeras, Veggie Wheels co-founder. "This was a way of communicating with and getting to know your community."

In communities where food deserts are increasingly common, Veggie Wheels offers a connection. It meets a tangible need in Cattaraugus County, but also strengthens the social fabric that holds communities together.

The challenges facing communities continue to evolve, and nonprofits operate in an environment of rising costs and growing demand. Small grants can mean stability, expansion, and – possibly – survival.

The Community Fund stands as a symbol of collective care. It represents neighbors investing in neighbors and the belief that strong communities are built intentionally, through partnership and shared responsibility.

As we reflect on the impact of the Community Fund in this annual report, we also look forward with gratitude – for the donors who make it possible, the volunteers who steward it and the nonprofits who transform its dollars into impact.

At its core, the Community Fund is more than a grant program – it's a promise that this community will continue to show up or itself.

Catalysts for Community: Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation Leverage Funds

An aging ballfield at Marcus Park sits quietly between neighborhood homes and the nearby Washington West Elementary School. For years, it has been mostly overlooked – a place with potential but little life. Until now.

Now, Marcus Park is home to an inclusive playground designed for children of all abilities – along with a dog park, a youth ballfield, picnic areas and a new connection to the community’s trail system.

The revitalization was part of a more than \$2 million project that includes collaboration by CRCF, Intandem and the City of Olean. The transformation didn’t happen overnight, and it surely didn’t happen alone.

Behind the playground is a larger story about partnership, vision and a type of funding designed to breathe fresh air into new ideas in rural communities.

Through the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Leverage Fund established at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation, strategic investments help local organizations unlock larger funding needed to turn community projects into reality. These investments can help nonprofits and municipalities strengthen grant applications, demonstrate local support and unlock increase opportunities for outside funding.

Matching funds for the inclusive playground were provided by the Leverage Fund to the tune of \$23,800.

Also in Olean, Southern Tier Health Care System, Inc. is undertaking a renovation project that will convert previously underused space into a training and wellness center designed to support both healthcare professionals and community members.

The project, which received a \$25,000 grant from the Leverage Fund, will transform the organization’s lower level into a fully accessible, multi-purpose space. Planned upgrades include installation of an ADA-compliant elevator, accessible restrooms, improved HVAC systems and technology-enable classrooms. A teaching kitchen will also be incorporated to support nutrition education and wellness programming.

Once complete, the space will host a variety of programs, including EMS and paramedic education, youth-focused initiatives such as Kids in the Kitchen and home-alone safety courses.

For a rural region where access to healthcare services and workforce development opportunities can be limited, the project is designed to expand both professional training and community programming.

Projects like this represent an important investment in long-term community well-being. Leverage funding has helped the organization advance the project by demonstrating local commitment.

While some projects focus on recreation or health services, others are exploring how creativity and culture can support economic vitality. In downtown Salamanca, an initiative – led by the Tri-County Arts Council – will blend public art, entrepreneurship and community engagement.

Painting with a Purpose will bring artists, business, tourism organizations and educators together to create a series of murals throughout the city. The project received an initial grant of \$20,000 from the Leverage Fund.

Plans call for eight permanent murals and eight movable installations that can be displayed throughout the community.

Organizers see the project as both a cultural initiative and an economic development effort. Public art has the potential to draw visitors, increase foot traffic for local businesses and strengthen the identity of a downtown district. The initiative aims to create opportunities for artists while also encouraging residents and visitors to spend more time exploring Salamanca’s downtown.

The first of these murals – a portrait of Chief Cornplanter – was finished in August of 2025, sitting on the side of Petruzzi Insurance Agency in Salamanca.

“The mural will educate the 3.5 million visitors to the city on the artist, history of the art, the business, Seneca Culture and the history of Salamanca,” said Salamanca Chamber of Commerce CEO John Sheehan. “Once the murals are completed, we will create a map to draw those visitors throughout our city to improve economic development.”

Taken together, these projects illustrate how strategic early investment can unlock larger opportunities.

The Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation Leverage Funds were created with the understanding that many transformative projects begin as ideas that simply need momentum. A timely investment can help organizations demonstrate readiness and unlock larger funding opportunities.

Across Cattaraugus County, that approach is helping bring a range of community priorities to life.

Each project addresses a different need – recreation, health, economic activity and cultural engagement – but they share a common thread. They reflect communities identifying opportunities for growth and working to turn those ideas into tangible improvements.

Through the partnership with CRCF, the Leverage Fund serves as a catalyst for that progress. They help ensure that local vision and collaboration are met with the resources needed to move projects forward.

The results may take many forms, but together they represent something larger – the steady, collaborative work of building stronger communities across the region.

Mental Wellness in Cattaraugus County Fund

The Mental Wellness in Cattaraugus County Fund was created to ensure local organizations have the resources they need to support mental health across the region. Established in 2018, the fund carries forward the mission and spirit of the former Mental Health Association in Cattaraugus County, providing grants to programs that promote emotional wellbeing, awareness, and access to care.

Through annual grant cycles, the fund supports nonprofit programs and licensed providers working directly with residents. Since its creation, it has distributed more than \$26,000 to strengthen services, expand outreach and help organizations respond to growing mental health needs. Grants from 2025 included \$2,000 to the Outdoor Arts & Recreation Society to offer nature-based mental health programming for underserved populations and \$2,500 to the Cattaraugus County Veterans Music Coalition Fund for assisting veterans through music.

The Mental Wellness Fund is a community-driven investment in healthier lives. Each grant reflects a shared commitment to reducing stigma, improving access to care and building a more resilient Cattaraugus County - one program, one organization and one life at a time.

The Ryan Callahan Memorial Fund was established in 2024 to provide grants to organizations that support mental health treatment and awareness. A year after its inception, the fund has made possible grants to two local nonprofit organizations to increase mental health services in the area.

St. Stephen's Episcopal Church received \$5,000 for counseling services at the Miram's Center for Hope and Healing, while the Cattaraugus County Department of Community Services Foundation for Change PROS was granted \$14,000 for mental health services. The personalized recover oriented services (PROS) aim to support participants' recovery through dedicated service while utilizing evidence-based practices to empower individuals with the goal of achieving hopeful, satisfying lives.

To help support this fund, Ryan's family organized the first Callahan Memorial Golf Tournament at Bartlett Country Club in Olean in June 2024, with the second taking place in June of 2025.

"There remains a great need for mental health care in our community," said CRCF Executive Director Kirk Windus. "Funds like this do a great deal in making mental health care more accessible."
