ripples of giving...ripples of good

While attending the Council on Foundation's annual conference this past year, CRCF Executive Director Karen Niemic Buchheit was privileged to hear Walter Isaacson, president and CEO of the Aspen Institute and Steve Jobs' biographer, speak about time he spent with Jobs toward the end of his life.

When he asked Jobs to look back on his life and his accomplishments, he said Jobs replied with this reflection: Life is like a river. We get to take things out that others put in before us. But what gave Jobs the most pleasure was not how much he took out, but what he put back.

We see the same satisfaction among donors at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation. When we talk to people about setting up a fund at the Community Foundation, we often refer to examples of other similar funds – whether it be a scholarship, a donor-designated fund or some other type of fund. We also point out pictures of both the donors and the grant recipients. There is a common factor in those photos – everyone is smiling! "Growing Good" in this case means growing the seeds of happiness – from a delighted giver to an appreciative recipient – where everyone feels good.

What that generous donor might not realize is that he or she is also getting back some pretty terrific intangibles (yes, there is a tax deduction – but read on for better news!).

Numerous studies now validate Jobs' sentiment that "giving back" makes us feel happy. Giving activates the region of the brain associated with pleasure and also increases good health. Scientists believe altruistic behavior releases endorphins in the brain, producing the positive feeling known as "helper's high." Studies show that giving can lower your stress level, strengthen your immune system and extend your life.

Giving also evokes gratitude, and research has found that gratitude is integral to happiness, health and a more optimistic outlook on life.

One gift can also have a ripple effect beyond the initial impact. When we give, we not only help the immediate recipient of our gift, but also create a ripple effect of generosity through our community. One donor's example can encourage others to follow suit – even more so when you add social media to the mix today.



"There are ample studies showing that when people receive generosity and compassion, there is a positive effect on their health and well-being," Stephen G. Post, PhD, a professor of bioethics at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine says. For example, "When a compassionate physician creates a safe haven for the ill patient, the patient experiences relief from stress," he explains.

"Humans have evolved to be caring and helpful to those around us, largely to ensure our survival," says Post. "In Darwin's Descent of Man, he mentions survival of the fittest only twice. He mentions benevolence 99 times."



and other reasons to establish a fund:

Ease – There is no need for incorporation, applying for 501(c)(3) status, etc. You can set up a fund with two standard forms.

Immediate tax advantage – Each donation to a Community Foundation fund is tax-deductible to the maximum allowed by law for the donor.

Lower administrative costs – The Foundation handles annual audit and 990 tax return for all funds; overall costs are shared among all funds as part of CRCF operations.

Investment management – All funds benefit from efficiencies of scale from the CRCF portfolio; no additional time and expenses are required to establish an investment account and policies.

Gift receipts – The Foundation acknowledges all gifts in writing and provides necessary receipts for tax deductions.

After you have considered the many possibilities available to you, the Foundation staff will do the rest.




