



Every donation, every grant and every scholarship is a testament to the generosity that runs deep in this community and an investment in a brighter community future. The donations we receive are recycled to the community in different forms, such as:

- Supporting students in their educational journeys through \$312,853 in scholarship awards.
- Meeting immediate needs like a grant that allowed Genesis House to furnish a new shelter facility that expanded their capacity and provided dedicated apartments to families.
- Strategically building stronger systems like support for Connecting Communities in Action to begin a new initiative that combats food desert conditions in western and northern Cattaraugus County (more on that later in the report) or support for the Laine Business Accelerator program that is building a healthier Cattaraugus County small business ecosystem.

Just as each grant represents a piece of a larger puzzle, each of us has the ability to help create the framework for a brighter future. For example, look at the collective generosity during our annual giving day – Cattaraugus Gives. 1,419 donors rallied together this year to raise \$331,512 for 91 local nonprofits.

Through scholarships, we have empowered local students to reach for their dreams. Many of our recipients have gone on to pursue careers in fields they are passionate about - some of those, and we hope more in the future, will return to this community to Grow Good in the community that raised them.

To quote Herman Melville: “We cannot live only for ourselves. A thousand fibers connect us with our fellow men.”

As you read through this report, we hope you see the many ways in which we are all connected – how the strength of our roots allows us to grow together.

Bridging gaps, building health

In Cattaraugus County, Connecting Communities in Action (CCA) has been a pillar of hope and support, steadfastly committed to giving back to its residents. Through a comprehensive array of services – including energy and housing assistance, nutrition programs, transitional support, victim advocacy and youth and family services – CCA addresses the multifaceted needs of the community.

Understanding that health is shaped by more than just medical care, CCA has taken a broader approach to community well-being. In 2022, CCA embarked on a pivotal initiative with funding from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC): the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Accelerator Plan. The planning process brought community stakeholders to the table to develop plans to tackle the underlying factors influencing health, such as economic stability, education, social and community context and health care access.

Out of that larger plan emerged a plan to address food insecurity for some of Cattaraugus County's most vulnerable populations, particularly those disproportionately living in food deserts in the western and northern part of the county. The data shows that food insecurity is one of the largest barriers to positive health outcomes.

CRCF rallied together with other funders in Western New York to ensure that CCA was given the resources to fully implement that plan – a plan with a budget of \$505,000 – by providing grants together totaling \$10,000, which is one of the Foundation's largest board-approved investments ever.

CCA received additional funding for the project from the Highmark Blue Cross Blue Shield Fund (\$280,000), Buffalo Bills Foundation (\$165,000) and the Western New York Foundation \$50,000).

Cattaraugus County spans approximately 1,300 square miles, predominantly rural, with a population exceeding 75,000. The community faces significant challenges: nearly 17% live below the poverty line, and over 5,800 households rely on SNAP benefits. A community needs assessment by CCA identified key contributors to poverty, including unemployment, substance abuse, limited education, low wages and challenges in relocating for better opportunities.

Health disparities are pronounced, with the county ranking 61 out of 62 in New York for health outcomes and factors. Barriers such as physician shortages, transportation issues, limited access to nutritious foods and escalating mental health concerns further exacerbate these challenges.

To combat these challenges, CCA has taken measures to implement their Social Determinants of Health Accelerator Program by preparing to host pop-up food pantries across the county.

CCA partnered with local business Mazza Mechanical Services to rework their walk-in cooler to store food products. In addition to the cooler, they recently purchased a van that is outfitted with a refrigerated freezer unit for their pop-up pantries.

Thanks to the investment of foundations including CRCF, a full-time project coordinator has been hired to lead the initiative, while CCA's current part-time pantry support staff has recently been appointed to a full-time position.

As a part of the plan, the pantries will have pre-made food packs to give out to those in need. Food boxes will be prepared to help those located in food deserts, while the food backpack program aims to provide food security to students over the weekends and over school breaks. In addition, food boxes with particular menus suited for common health issues will also be available.

"The Social Determinants of Health Accelerator Plan is more than just a strategy; it's our vision at CCA for a community where everyone can thrive," said CCA CEO Andrew Studley. "By tackling the root causes of health disparities and encouraging collaboration among service providers and foundations, we're paving the way for a healthier, more equitable future for Cattaraugus County."

The SDOH Accelerator Plan represents a bold step toward creating lasting change in Cattaraugus County. Guided by a shared commitment between CCA and CRCF, this initiative seeks to eliminate the underlying barriers to good health. Through united efforts across service organizations and philanthropic partners, the plan aims to build a stronger foundation for equity and well-being throughout the community.

CCA's efforts serve as a hopeful reminder that when a community comes together with shared purpose and determination, meaningful change can grow, opening the door to new possibilities.

"In essence, the goal of the SDOH accelerator was to task community agencies to design the ideal programs that would remove the socio-economic barriers between Cattaraugus County residents and positive health outcomes," said CRCF Executive Director Kirk Windus. "The implementation of this plan is ambitious and costly – but it takes ambition, collaboration and investment to tackle big problems."

"We had extensive discussions with our board, some of the other funders involved and with the CCA team while exploring these grants," he continued. "In the end, we decided to invest \$10,000 -- \$5,000 from our Community Fund to help purchase necessary supplies, and \$5,000 from the Cattaraugus County Nonprofit Hub Fund to build CCA's capacity to implement the initiative – because we believe in this plan and its ability to fight hunger in some of our most vulnerable communities."

Stronger Together

At the forefront of a strong community is a group of leaders that aim to bring awareness to civic issues and how they plan to address them.

Enter: The Cattaraugus County Nonprofit Hub.

In October 2024, the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation – in conjunction with the Dr. Lyle F. Renodin Foundation and the United Way of Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties – launched the Cattaraugus Nonprofit Hub, a countywide initiative designed to enhance collaboration among civic organizations throughout Cattaraugus County. Since, St. Bonaventure University's Office of the President has lent its support as part of the hub leadership.

The Hub provides a vital space for nonprofits and government agencies to come together, share resources and strengthen the local nonprofit ecosystem.

A significant boost that paved the way for the beginning of this initiative came by way of a \$100,000 grant awarded by the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation to formalize and bolster the Nonprofit Hub. This funding underscores the importance of building community and collaboration among nonprofits, as emphasized by CRCF Executive Director Kirk Windus: "We see value in building community and collaboration in our nonprofits. We can always respond to the most pressing needs of our community better together than we can alone."

Larry Sorokes, a seasoned nonprofit leader with extensive experience in economic and community development, is helping to shape the Hub's curriculum and facilitate discussions that empower local organizations.

"The Cattaraugus region has a rich history of strong nonprofits that contribute so much to the wellbeing and quality of life for our residents," said Sorokes. "The presence of this new supportive resource will benefit both established and emerging organizations, and we are already off to a great start."

The Nonprofit Hub, which is open to all nonprofit and civic groups in Cattaraugus County, gives organizations the opportunity to collaborate on shared challenges and develop innovative solutions. Topics covered include public-private partnerships, nonprofit leadership and community development strategies.

On November 7, 2024, the Hub hosted its first official gathering at St. Bonaventure University, where nonprofit and government leaders came together to discuss key social issues. Two major community initiatives were highlighted at the convening:

- **"Pantry to Table" Initiative** – Led by Connecting Communities in Action, this program aims to establish 18 pop-up food pantries per quarter to distribute healthy meal kits, improving long-term food security for families.
- **Mobile Integrated Healthcare Program** – Donna Kahm, President of the Southern Tier Health Care System, introduced this program, which will bring medical services directly to residents, reducing barriers to healthcare access and lowering emergency room visits.

These projects reflect the Hub's mission: to tackle the root causes of local challenges through collective action and cross-sector collaboration.

In early 2025, when government funding was brought into question by action at the executive level of federal government, the Hub served as a central source of information and resources for Cattaraugus County nonprofits.

"Government at all levels and nonprofits historically have had a mutually beneficial relationship in which each work together to fill gaps and reach the populations that the other may not be able to," said Windus. "Part of the goal for the nonprofit hub was to set a table for nonprofit staff and board leadership and government officials, both elected and appointed, to deepen that mutually beneficial relationship here in Cattaraugus County."

"It was timely and critical in our opinion to reinforce that idea through our nonprofit hub at a time when there was so much confusion around federal funding," he added. "At a time of national contention, we had discussions about government grants and funding with our nonprofits, with our state assemblyman and aides from our congressman and senators' offices on the call."

With funding secured through 2026, the Cattaraugus Nonprofit Hub is working to establish itself as a long-term resource for the county. In addition to offering grant funding for organizations pursuing collaborative projects, the Hub plans to expand its programming to ensure nonprofits have the tools and support they need to thrive.

At its core, the Hub represents what it means to be rooted in community – bringing people and organizations together to create lasting change. By fostering a spirit of cooperation, it ensures that Cattaraugus County's nonprofits are not just serving the community, but growing and evolving alongside it.

Growing Through Giving: The Legacy of Rebekah Love

"You never know the positive impact you might have on someone's life."

– Rebekah Love

When someone leaves a lasting mark on a community, that impact can resonate for years to come. For one anonymous donor, the influence of Rebekah Love – a beloved kindergarten teacher at Ten Broeck Academy/Franklinville Central School – was especially meaningful.

Diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) at the age of 17, Rebekah faced life's challenges with an unwavering spirit, dedicating 16 years to nurturing young minds before her illness necessitated early retirement. Her resilience and positivity left an indelible mark on her students and colleagues alike.

Beyond the classroom, Rebekah's family is the center of her world. A devoted mother and wife, she instilled in her children the same values of kindness, perseverance and love for learning that she brought to her students. Her family describes her as someone who finds joy in the little moments, always ensuring that love and laughter filled their home.

In October 2023, the anonymous donor, deeply touched by Rebekah's influence, established the Rebekah Love Family Scholarship Fund at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation.

Philanthropy has the power to shape a community by nurturing its roots – honoring those who have made a difference and creating opportunities for others to follow in their footsteps. Through generosity, individuals can spark lasting change, strengthening bonds and ensuring that the values of compassion, perseverance and education continue to flourish.

In honoring Rebekah's legacy, the donor hopes to inspire others to give, reinforcing the idea that one person's impact can grow into something much larger – something that uplifts an entire community for generations to come.

This scholarship aims to honor graduating seniors from Ten Broeck Academy/Franklinville Central School who have demonstrated academic success and are pursuing post-secondary education. Preference is given to those entering the fields of education or nursing, reflecting Rebekah's dedication to teaching and her enduring compassion. Additionally, the scholarship seeks to support students who, like Rebekah, have faced adversity and persevered with a positive attitude. Rebekah's daughter, Mandy Zuech, reflected on her mother's enduring influence: "I run into her former students often, and they always ask about her and say she was their favorite teacher." This sentiment was echoed by the donor, who wished to create a lasting tribute to Rebekah's impact on her students.

The inaugural scholarships were awarded in August 2024 to Catherine McAuley and Gabriela Chesebro. Catherine is pursuing nursing at Jamestown Community College, and Gabriela is studying business management at Keuka College. Their achievements embody the scholarship's mission to support students who excel academically and demonstrate resilience.

CRCF Executive Director Kirk Windus remarked, "Rebekah Love is one of those unsung heroes who exhibits the character traits that make our world a better place. It is an honor to steward this donor's thoughtful and kind gift and to perpetuate Love's legacy of positivity by supporting students from Franklinville as they pursue higher education."

As the fund continues to grow, so too does its impact.

The Rebekah Love Family Scholarship Fund stands as a testament to the deep connections forged within the Franklinville community. It not only commemorates Rebekah's enduring legacy but also exemplifies how acts of unselfishness can bring a community together, setting the foundation for growth and endurance for future generations.



Rooted in Rhythm

Melodies can often intertwine with memories.

The Rock On Reikin Memorial Music Fund stands as a testament to the enduring power of music and the bonds it forges. Established in memory of Reikin Reynolds, a guitarist and vocalist from Cuba, New York, this fund embodies the spirit of a young man whose passion for music will continue to inspire and uplift.

Reikin's journey into the world of music began at the age of 16 when he purchased his first guitar. His dedication to mastering the instrument was evident as he immersed himself in diverse genres, drawing inspiration from Buddy Holly, Green Day and Blink 182. From self-taught renditions of classics to contemporary hits, Reikin's musical journey showcased his versatility and commitment.

Eager to elevate his playing, he joined Beat City Music in Olean, where he found not just lessons but a community of like-minded individuals who shared his musical fervor.

Tragically, in July 2024, Reikin's life was cut short at the age of 19.

In the wake of this profound loss, his family sought to honor his legacy by ensuring that his love for music would continue to resonate within the community. This vision led to the creation of the Rock On Reikin Memorial Music Fund at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation.

"Reikin had a beautiful, giving and loving heart," said Christie Reynolds, Reikin's mother. "Compassion ran through his veins, and he genuinely wanted those around him to feel special, accepted and happy. Reikin was a wonderful, loyal young man who was willing to lend a helping hand to family, friends and animals in need without hesitation."

The fund's mission is to provide financial support to area youth for instrumental music lessons and music classes, thereby nurturing the next generation of musicians and keeping Reikin's spirit alive. The fund provides grants to Strength Solutions – a nonprofit organization that provides character strength assessments for individuals and organizations to help establish goals that can be achieved through a multitude of professional skills – who then provide support for participation in music classes.

The establishment of the fund was a community endeavor. The Reynolds family organized multiple fundraisers, including a special campaign in October 2024, Reikin's birth month, to commemorate what would have been his 20th birthday. Their goal was to share Reikin's love for music to inspire others and provide opportunities for young artists to thrive.

Contributions poured in from friends, family and local supporters, reflecting the deep impact Reikin had on those around him. Local bands dedicated performances to his memory, and community members shared heartfelt stories of his kindness, humor and audacious enthusiasm for music. Each donation and tribute underscored the sense of unity and remembrance the fund represents.

Beyond the financial support it offers, the Rock on Reikin Memorial Music Fund also serves as a source of encouragement for young musicians. By lowering financial barriers to music education, the fund empowers students to explore their artistic talents and pursue their dreams. This ripple effect of support echoes the generosity and love that Reikin shared during his lifetime.

In November of 2024, with the funds raised from Reikin's birthday fundraiser, two Cattaraugus County teenagers were selected to be the first recipients of 4 months of private instrumental lessons with instructors from Beat City Music.

At its core, the Rock on Reikin Memorial Music Fund exemplifies the profound connection between individual passions and community enrichment. By transforming grief into a source of collective hope and creativity, the fund not only preserves Reikin's memory but also strengthens the arts and culture movement in our community. It serves as a poignant reminder that when we come together, rooted in shared values and aspirations, we can create enduring legacies that harmonize with the rhythms of our communal heart.



Swizzy's Cause

Swizzy's Cause, established in 2016, is a program by the YMCA of the Twin Tiers in collaboration with Intandem dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for individuals battling mental illnesses. The initiative was inspired by the tragic loss of Jessica Sweitzer, a young mother from Olean, who struggled with bipolar disorder and depression for a decade before her passing. Her parents, Pat and Barb Sweitzer, transformed their grief into a mission to support others facing similar challenges.

Community support is vital for the sustainability of Swizzy's Cause. Donations directly fund the Jessica Sweitzer Memorial Fund, managed as part of the YMCA of the Twin Tiers Endowment at CRCF, which underwrites the program's services, with the program receiving \$1,000 in monthly support from the Sweitzer Fund at CRCF. Fundraising events, such as the annual calendar raffle and chicken barbecue, play a crucial role in raising awareness and resources. Additionally, the program educates the community about mental illness, aiming to increase understanding and reduce stigma.

Swizzy's Cause provides financial assistance to individuals who are unable to afford a YMCA membership. Individuals are then paired with a care coordinator on staff at the YMCA who collaborates with available service providers (psychiatrists, counselors, mental health services) to improve quality of life.

Cattaraugus County/Gene and Charlotte Preston Fund for the Elderly

In an effort to help the elderly population remain in their homes safely, the Cattaraugus County/Gene and Charlotte Preston Fund for the Elderly makes annual funding available to the Cattaraugus County Department for the Aging. The fund was established at the dissolution of the Cattaraugus Development Corporation in 2022 in order to carry out the work of that agency in supporting seniors as they age.

Grants from the fund go towards a bevy of different matters, including: providing housing support by paying back taxes, rent or mortgage payments for elderly residents in financial need, providing legal support/ services to resolve housing issues, or to pay for repairs needed to make a home handicapped-accessible or address code violations to allow residents to stay in their homes as long as possible. Since it was established, the fund has provided over \$30,000 in grants to support seniors and necessary home improvements.

In 2024, the fund supported two grants for home repairs to keep seniors in their dwelling, including a grant that allowed for the replacement of a broken water pressure tank with a new one that was installed into the residence of an elderly client of the Cattaraugus County Department of Aging and another for repairs to the roof of a client through Rural Revitalization Corporation.
