



None of what we accomplished in 2020 would be possible without the generosity and giving spirit of our community.





COVID-19 relief

We all remember the uncertainty of the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic. One thing we were certain of from the very beginning was that there was a need for a coordinated philanthropic response.

On the very day that Governor Cuomo issued the first executive orders reducing in-person work and other restrictions, we were discussing, as a board, the formation of the COVID-19 Response Fund for Cattaraugus County along with two philanthropic partners, the United Way of Cattaraugus County and Dr. Lyle F. Renodin Foundation.

Within days we had laid the ground work for the fund and began fundraising. Since those early days, the fund has made possible over \$70,000 in grants to nonprofit organizations working on the front lines of the COVID-19 response. The first round of funding focused on providing for support of basic human needs like food, clothing and shelter, including grants to Cattaraugus Community Action, Olean Food Pantry, Meals on Wheels, The Master's Plan in South Dayton and more. The second round of funding continued this focus, with the addition of grants to organizations that had seen a loss of revenue do the pandemic.

Those grants supported a number of food pantries, shelters and utility support programs all across the county, almost all of which have seen a dramatic increase in demand through the pandemic, provided funding for technology needs for organizations supporting victims of domestic violence, substance abuse and mental health, support for organizations educating caregivers during a time of extraordinary challenges for the elderly and even supported newly established pet food pantries so people wouldn't have to choose between feeding their animals or their families — the list goes on.

Additionally, the leaders of the COVID-19 Response Fund helped coordinate other funding programs, including the WNY COVID-19 Community Response Microgrant Fund for Cattaraugus County, established by a number of philanthropic partners in Western New York, and the Blue Fund Microgrants program for Cattaraugus County, led by Blue Cross Blue Shield of WNY. Together leaders of the COVID-19 Response Fund for Cattaraugus County and other nonprofit leaders from all over Cattaraugus County worked to identify and suggest grants to charitable organizations helping those impacted by the pandemic. The first round of grants, made from the WNY COVID-19 Community Response Fund at the suggestion of Foundation leaders and partners topped \$130,000. Later, these funds supported an additional \$40,000 through microgrant programs.

All told, the impact of efforts led by CRCF and other partners made possible over \$200,000 in funding in direct response to the COVID-19 pandemic. That grant funding meant food on the table of families who had lost jobs, utility support for those who couldn't make payments, mental health support for people living in isolation and more.

The coordinated response to the pandemic proves again, that even on our most difficult day, we are stronger together. So much was accomplished in 2020 through collaboration, and we enter 2021 with a renewed strength and spirit, knowing those relationships will continue and only grow to provide for those in need.

A community coming together Cattaraugus Gives



CATTARAUGUS In a year where we had to be socially distant, Cattaraugus Gives brought our community GiVES together virtually to champion and support nonprofits in Cattaraugus County.

In just 24 hours on Tuesday, December 1, the 70 participating nonprofits raised \$284,812 from 1,224 donors, representing over 2,000 donations. In the days following, that total eclipsed over a quarter million dollars.



Like many other meetings and events of 2020, the Cattaraugus Gives celebration ceremony was held via Zoom this year.

With the support of local businesses and CRCF, over \$12,000 in prizes bolstered the fundraising efforts of the participating nonprofits, leading to a remarkably successful day of giving at a time when need was higher than ever.

It is hard to summarize what a quarter million dollars means to the nonprofits who participated in Cattaraugus Gives – but with the many cancelled fundraisers of 2020, the increased demand for services of so many nonprofits - we know that a quarter million dollars raised means stronger nonprofits at a critical time for our community.

In 2020, the Olean Food Pantry reported an increase in need of some 60%. Likewise, Meals on Wheels of Cattaraugus County reported a 60% increase in the number of meals delivered to homebound seniors across the county. Despite its physical location being closed to the public for most of the year, the YMCA of the Twin Tiers pivoted to provide a shepherding program that encouraged community members to contact the most vulnerable in our community, providing fellowship in a time of seclusion as well as support (help picking up groceries, prescriptions, etc.) if necessary. The Y also launched an initiative to provide child care and distance learning resources as families faced the challenges of parents returning to work while schools were closed or leading a hybrid schedule.

And those are just a few examples. The money raised during Cattaraugus Gives supports those initiatives and other similar efforts, making sure that our nonprofits remain strong and viable despite the challenges they face.

What's more, Cattaraugus Gives is a celebration of the spirit of the Cattaraugus County Community. This year included music (provided by the Chumps, Dylan Snyder and Whitney Riley via Facebook Live), prizes and lots of joyful social media activity, celebrating the idea that we are better together.





It takes all of us, together Social justice through philanthropy

COVID-19 was not the only turbulent challenge facing communities across the nation in 2020. The death of George Floyd in Minnesota led to widespread discussion on the status of racial relations and racial/social justice in the U.S., and our local community was no different.

In fact, Olean and Cattaraugus County even found its way into national news as one of the many small, rural communities that were home to demonstrations in the wake of Floyd's death.

James Baldwin once wrote, "We are responsible for the world in which we find ourselves, if only because we are the only sentient force which can change it."

In that spirit, Della Moore, who came to Olean by way of Philadelphia, long had a dream to establish a hub for African American history and culture in Olean, knowing all along that if we can begin to understand each other's history that we can create healthier relationships.

In 2020, Moore formed a relationship with CRCF to help finally bring that dream to fruition in the form of a permanent home for the African American Center for Cultural Development she founded and led for years, all without a permanent location.

After local attorneys Ed Wagner and Jack Hart gifted their practice's former building to the center, Moore and the board of the AACCD established an agency fund to support renovation and fundraising efforts to not only renovate the center's new home (which is planned to open in the Fall of 2021) but to support a sustainable future for the nonprofit serving a critical mission at a critical juncture.

In the short time since the fund's establishment, it has made possible generous donations from community members for a new roof, architectural consulting to enable building of gallery and museum space, and that is only the beginning.

Much in the same spirit, others chose to play their own part in being a force for change – like the Hull family, who established the Robert E. Hull VMD Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Hull, an Olean native, was a successful veterinarian in the Pittsburgh area. In his last days, he watched news coverage of the death of Floyd with his sister, Karen Hull, also of Olean. The incident led him to the idea to establish a scholarship for minority students, an effort to play a part in leveling the playing field for students of color.

Upon his passing, the family established the scholarship fund at CRCF with a first preference for Olean High School minority and female students.

The aspirations of Moore and the center for cultural development and the Hull family embody a belief and value of the Foundation: Together we can "Grow Good" and create a better tomorrow for all through philanthropy.

Pandemic-proof recreation: Disc golf coming to Olean

Since the beginning of the pandemic, many have searched for safe, socially distanced sources of recreation. Across the country, many have found that activity in disc golf. Disc golf is played much like the traditional form of golf, except a set of frisbees replaces a bag of clubs, and a chain link tower collects those frisbees instead of a hole. Rich Longer led a number of disc golf enthusiasts to the Olean City Council with a proposal to install a disc golf course at Gargoyle Park, a long under-used park in Olean bordering Allegany, the Allegheny River Valley Trail and a short distance from St. Bonaventure University. When the council permitted the project, Longer and the Twin Tiers Disc Golf Club turned to CRCF as a fiscal sponsor and fundraising supporter.



In just a couple short months, the fund has raised enough to install a nine-hole disc golf course at Gargoyle Park with plans to install a second nine later. Construction (a very minimal affair, with little to no alteration of the park landscape outside of course equipment installation) is set to begin in the spring of this year. The course is planned to be built up to professional standards, allowing the new course, the first in Cattaraugus County, to host amateur and professional tournaments, which will bring disc golf enthusiasts from across the country together right here in Cattaraugus County.



Gratitude and Growing Good

Kaleigh Wilday spent much of her time in Ellicottville, skiing and adventuring outdoors with her family. When she passed away tragically in 2002, much of the early support for the fund bearing her name at CRCF came from friends of the Wilday family in Ellicottville. To this day, many of the gifts to the Wilday Fund, especially around Kaleigh's birthday in November, come from Ellicottville.




Christine Pagett



Lukomski began her college career at Gannon University, where she studied biochemistry and biology while playing on Gannon's Division II women's volleyball team. At Gannon Lukomski was the first Elite 90 recipient, an award to the student athlete at the national championship with the highest GPA. She is now enrolled at Eastern Virginia Medical School, where she is involved in Medical French, where students also work on French speaking abilities in order to work with refugees from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Haiti. She is currently involved with a number of medical organizations, including the Human Values in Medicine Committee, where she is an elected member and the HOPES Mental Health Clinic at East Virginia Medical School, where she provides care to uninsured patients. She is also still involved with mentoring members of the Gannon Volleyball team who hope to attend medical school.

After medical school, she hopes to go onto residencies in a number of specialty areas. She especially hopes to do medical work in French speaking countries in Africa. Lukomski said that scholarship support allowed her to pursue her dreams of being a physician. She said that her experience growing up in Cattaraugus County inspired that original dream of being a physician. "Cattaraugus County is a medically underserved area, and I had some very positive interactions with physicians in this area which encouraged me in my pursuit of medicine," said the Portville native who is sure to go on to grow good of her own in the medical field.
